TWO Sections: Open & Reserve (U1400)

Prizes (b/20 paid entries):

Open: \$70-50 U1700: \$40

U1400: \$50-40 U1200: \$30-15

If a player has a claim to two (or more) prizes, cash prizes shall be awarded in accordance with USCF Rule 32B.

Format and Time Control:

Swiss-system pairings (no eliminations).

Open Section, 5 rounds: G/45, +10 inc.
(Dual-rated)

Reserve Section, 5 rounds: G/45, d/5.
(Dual-rated)

Schedule:

(Open Section) 9:00 a.m., 11:00 a.m., 1:15 p.m., 3:15 p.m., 5:15* p.m.

(Reserve Section) 9:30 a.m., 11:15 a.m., 1:30 p.m., 3:15 p.m., 5:00 p.m.*

* - Note: For Open and Reserve Sections, round 5 will be paired as soon as possible after the previous round has finished. If both players agree, games in round may start before the scheduled round time, i.e., if your opponent agrees, you may start your game as soon as the pairings have been posted even though it may be before the official round time. Otherwise, you must wait until the scheduled round times noted above to start the clock.

Entry: \$15 if registered and paid by Friday, December 15th (at www.utahchess.com), \$25 late/onsite

Byes: Half-point byes – Two (2) half-point byes may be taken but must be requested prior to pairing of Rd 2 (i.e., at least 15 minutes before scheduled time for round 2 in your section). All bye requests are irrevocable after that time. (See USCF Rule 22C, especially Rule 22C4.) Additional byes (i.e., more than one per player) will be zero-point byes.

Advance Registration: Register online at the registration link on www.utahchess.com.

Onsite Registration: Onsite registration is from 8:30 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. Players arriving after their registration cutoff who have not registered and paid in advance will be given a half-point bye for round one and paired for round two or paired for round one at the TD's discretion.

Players are responsible for supplying equipment (pieces, board and clock) and for knowing how to set clocks. (USCF Rule 16B)
